G combines beginner instruction, “einfachen Grundschriften”, with independent booking: “Jede Stunde lässt sich separat buchen, eine regelmäßige Teilnahme ist nicht nötig.”

B offers adult cooking instruction and care covering the child's age and the full session: “Während der gesamten Kurszeit spielen Kinder von drei bis sechs Jahren mit unserem Betreuungsteam im Nebenraum.”

15: I

I offers “ein stilles Wochenende zu zweit” with rooms and walking access: “Vom Bahnhof geht ihr in zehn Minuten zu uns.” E requires arrival by car.

16: A

A schedules live drawing at 20:00 and permits separate locations: “Ihr könnt euch als Paar anmelden und von zwei verschiedenen Wohnungen aus einwählen.”

17: F

F addresses recurring household disagreements. Its format is private and in person: “Bei jedem Termin ist ausschließlich ein Paar mit unserer Beraterin im Raum. Die Gespräche finden persönlich in unserer Praxis statt.” H serves several couples together.

18: J

J provides a guide and meets the schedule and duration constraints: “Start ist samstags um 10 Uhr am Dorfplatz. Nach zweieinhalb Stunden sind wir wieder dort, und ihr könnt den Nachmittag frei gestalten.”

19: O

C is the only pottery offer, but it requires six weeks and full booking: “Die Arbeitsschritte bauen aufeinander auf; gebucht wird deshalb die gesamte Reihe.” None of the other advertisements offers pottery.

Elif's initial objection concerns an entire day. She supports the actual limited proposal: “Für genau diesen Zeitraum sollte die Stadt solche Veranstaltungen untersagen.”

23: nein

Gregor distinguishes personal avoidance from public regulation: “Die Stadt sollte Veranstaltungen in dieser Zeit nicht verbieten.”

24: ja

Sabine's current stance supersedes her earlier objection: “Ich bin inzwischen dafür, Veranstaltungen draußen bei über 30 Grad zwischen zwölf und sechzehn Uhr zu verbieten.”

25: nein

Arne supports a restriction only for children's events. He rejects the full proposal: "Diesen Teil lehne ich ab und damit auch die Regel in der vorgeschlagenen Form."

26: ja

Judith's enforcement doubts do not change her support: "Deshalb unterstütze ich das geplante Verbot."
