Doubts about eliminating every complaint do not change his support: "Trotzdem würde ich den Vorschlag annehmen". He explicitly applies exclusive club balls to every adult tournament.

26: ja

Her current stance supersedes her initial opposition: "Bei sämtlichen Erwachsenenturnieren sollten wir bei den Bällen des Vereins bleiben."
