13: 0

No advertisement offers the required equipment, location and rental period together. B keeps its demonstration robots at the shop: “die Vorführgeräte bleiben im Markt”. H rents manually operated equipment: “Sie führen das Gerät selbst über den Rasen”. The remaining advertisements offer other services or goods.

14: G

G offers repeated mowing during an absence: “schneiden wir Ihren Rasen während Ihrer Abwesenheit in vereinbarten Abständen”. Its booking range explicitly includes “drei Wochen Sommerurlaub”.

15: C

C covers an existing purchase and installation at the customer's property: “richten das bereits gekaufte Gerät passend zu Ihrem Grundstück ein”. Personal operating instruction follows: “Anschließend bedienen wir es gemeinsam mit Ihnen”.

16: J

J offers seeds for converting lawn into flowers for insects. The accompanying instructions cover the full process: “alte Grasfläche vorbereiten, Samen verteilen und die jungen Pflanzen versorgen”.

17: A

A is a Saturday workshop where participants practise the required maintenance themselves: “An gewöhnlichen Rasenmähern zum Schieben üben Sie selbst, Gehäuse zu säubern und bewegliche Teile zu pflegen.”

18: F

F offers storage from October to March and also shorter stays lasting several months. Cleaning precedes storage: “Vor dem Einlagern entfernen wir Grasreste und Schmutz gründlich.”

19: D

D assesses the actual property before purchase: “Bevor Sie sich für ein Gerät entscheiden, schauen wir uns Ihr Grundstück an.” The visit specifically covers “schmale Durchgänge zwischen den Rasenflächen”.

20: ja

Anke values private tracking but supports removing public rankings, including consensual ones: “Auch mit unserer Zustimmung wird er dadurch nicht sinnvoller. Solche Listen gehören aus den Studios entfernt”.

21: nein

Bilal supports continued rankings when consent and withdrawal are properly handled: “Wenn ein Studio das so organisiert, darf es diesen Wettbewerb ruhig weiter anbieten.” This rejects the proposal's inclusion of voluntary rankings.

22: nein

Corinna proposes reduced frequency rather than prohibition: “nur einmal im Monat eine öffentliche Liste zu zeigen”. Her conclusion confirms this: “Ganz abschaffen würde ich sie nicht.”

23: ja

Dirk's current position replaces his earlier enjoyment: “Heute würde ich dafür stimmen, dass Studios diese Ranglisten abschaffen.” His account explicitly includes voluntary participation.

24: nein

Esther separates her own refusal to participate from others' choice: “Das sind erwachsene Menschen, die selbst entscheiden können.” She explicitly rejects the proposal.

25: ja

Faruk acknowledges that comparisons will continue elsewhere but maintains support: "Damit sollte Schluss sein." His final sentence explicitly states that other rankings are no reason to reject the proposal.

26: ja

Gesine questions whether group participation is freely chosen and endorses removal for everyone: "Wenn im Studio für alle die öffentlichen Schrittlisten verschwinden, muss sich niemand mehr erklären." Private tracking remains available in her account.
