The visitors expect one focus but encounter another, so the replacement connector “stattdessen” is required.

The groups spend time inside the workshops, so the locative relative form is “in denen”.

5: d

The specially developed audio scenes function as the instrument of explanation, introduced by “mithilfe”.

The tour management accommodates ongoing production work; the fixed expression is “Rücksicht nehmen auf”.
