**1: b**

The opening implies that contentment is not inherently evidence of a good situation because it can also reflect long-term accommodation to conditions below one's standards.

**2: c**

The source explicitly distinguishes satisfaction with the work itself from dissatisfaction about lacking autonomy.

**3: a**

The passage explicitly describes rumination as generalizing a specific problem while delaying targeted action.

**4: a**

The source explicitly recommends tracking the contexts in which the discomfort appears and checking whether it persists after rest.

**5: b**

The source states a two-step method: define a concrete discrepancy and test a small, time-limited change.

**6: c**

The detail requires expressing the underlying need without accusation and inviting the other person's perspective before proposing a solution.

**7: a**

The source explicitly states that pressure to appear content can cause legitimate doubts to be treated as individual failure.

**8: d**

The criticism is implied through examples in which continuous self-monitoring reproduces the dissatisfaction it claims to solve.

**9: b**

The source explicitly presents temporary acceptance as conserving effort where conditions cannot currently change while preserving awareness of actionable areas.

**10: c**

The conclusion implies that an experiment can be valuable by reducing uncertainty and clarifying non-negotiable limits even when it does not improve the situation.
